Session 1: Rigging a Fly Rod

This session focusses on fly rod components and how to set up and care for a fly rod.

You will learn how to:

- Assemble a [fly] rod
- Attach and thread a fly reel
- Set up a basic fly rig
- Select the appropriate leader and hook sizes
- Create a leader and a tippet
- Attach a fly, an indicator, weight
- Break down and store the rod and reel

Session 2: Casting

We will meet at a local pond where you will be able to practice casting, unhooking and releasing fish.

You will learn how to:

- Perform an overhand cast
- Perform a roll cast
- Unhook and release fish

Session 3: Fishing with a Float Tube

This session introduces students to lake fishing in a float tube and provides practice navigating and casting from a float tube.

You will learn how to:

- Inflate and set up a float tube
- Navigate a lake

Session 4: Selecting Flies

You will learn techniques for identifying bugs (fish food) and then practice selecting flies.
